Frances Court in Agriculture Gets All Wrapped up for Christmas



Princes Court on the Brompton Road in Knightsbridge is a large block of apartments on the opposite side of the road to Harrods in London.

Bourne Construction and Refurbishment placed an order of just under £500,000.00 with Benchmark to erect a fully boarded access scaffold to all elevations of the building, including light wells and court yards.

The main elevation on Brompton Road has a heavy duty gantry/ pedestrian protection tunnel built off the footpath to support the main scaffold above and still maintaining clear and safe access into the shops, restaurants and front main entrance to the building below.

The project has proved to be a logistical nightmare for Keith Dunk, our site manager and his team of Scott Dunk (his son), Marvin Parker-O'Neil, Terry Cheeseman and Alfie Mullins.

All materials for the front, side elevations and the front open court yard had to be delivered and unloaded between 06.00am and 07.00am due to

the site being on a bus lane, a red route and have a pedestrian crossing and bus stop to work around. The foot path could not be closed so the gantry was built during normal working hours with small localised exclusion zones, but keeping access into the building at street level at all times.

The rear and remaining side elevations commence in the New Year with a different set of challenges as access in this location is on an adjoining property's land. Negotiations are still ongoing.

The scaffold on Brompton Road and the side elevation, Lancelot Place have been built to also support an advertising banner at gantry level and a complete replacer banner of the existing façade from first floor level to roof level.

The two photographs show the building before the scaffold was erected and then after the scaffold was fully erect and covered with the advertising and replacer banners.

Safety Leadership Team

Terms of Reference

Purpose:

Maintain & continually improve health, safety & wellbeing by promoting consultation, co-operation and co-ordination between management & workforce. Ensure active engagement in the ongoing development of health, safety and wellbeing programs.

Objective:

The role of this safety team leadership is to assist the Benchmark Scaffolding management team in discharging its health & safety responsibilities.

Meetings:

- Meetings will be held at least quarterly, with further meetings arranged as needed.
- The safety leadership team will report all recommendations, key issues and findings to the Benchmark scaffolding management team.

Membership:

A representative of the Benchmark scaffolding safety team and a senior manager must be in attendance along with at least two members of the workforce appointed members.

Anyone employed by Benchmark Scaffolding can apply to be a member. It is the aim of the safety leadership team to rotate membership and no member may serve more than twelve months.

The safety leadership team will have a maximum of eleven members.

Safety Leadership *Team (SLT)*

The London region has started a safety leadership team (SLT). What this means is that, on a regular basis, scaffolders and managers meet to discuss what's happening out on site.

We meet in a formal setting, minutes are taken, recommendations noted and action points agreed. All recommendations are then discussed with Benchmarks senior management, with a view to implementing them.

The things we discuss are-

What can we do better? What do we need to improve? What's working well? What needs to stop?

There is also a section where you can put forward your ideas and initiatives to make all our work life healthier, safer and productive.

We need 11 members, so please contact the office and put your name forward if you have something to offer.

The next meeting is in February 2019.

In this hectic modern world in which we live it can sometimes seem that the pressure of work, relationships or financial strain can sometimes be overwhelming and leaves you feeling it is difficult to cope and the burden you are carrying is weighing you down. This is felt by most people at some time in their lives and it is a natural process that occurs when you feel you are under external stresses that are out of your control. If you do feel this way it is time to speak to someone about your difficulties and to seek professional help just as you would with a physical injury. In

the macho industry of construction it is a misconception that it is a sign of weakness to seek help, it is in fact a strength that will ease the strain and quickly get you back to taking control. Remember it is ok to not be ok and there is help available when you need it!

There have been over 1,400 suicides in the construction industry in the last 5 years. The number of construction workers that take time off work, suffering from stress or mental health issues, is 50 times more than those people that take time off due to accidents. Mental Health is big news at the moments and rightly so. This issue has not been very well publicised in the past. Now we need to do something about it. At the moment we have 2 people trained as mental health first aiders; Bill Wood in our Northern Region (07799 797226), and myself, Peter Booth (07799 797205) in our London Region. We will be

expanding the number of mental health trained people to probably 3 in the North and 6 in the South. If you have any doubts, no matter how small, about your feelings you will be able to talk to these people in strictest confidence and they will guide you on how to get help.

Signs and symptoms of mental illness can vary, depending on the disorder, circumstances, and other factors. Mental illness symptoms can affect your emotions, thoughts and behaviours.

Examples of signs and symptoms include:

- Feeling sad or down
- Confused thinking or reduced ability to concentrate
- Excessive fears or worries, or extreme feelings of guilt
- Extreme mood changes of highs and lows
- Withdrawal from friends and activities
- Significant tiredness, low energy or problems sleeping
- Detachment from reality (delusions), paranoia or hallucinations
- Inability to cope with daily problems or stress
- Trouble understanding and relating to situations and to people
- Alcohol or drug abuse
- Major changes in eating habits
- Sex drive changes
- Excessive anger, hostility or violence
- Suicidal thinking

At the beginning of November 2018 Benchmark Scaffolding were proud to announce that they have been certified by the **Living Wage Foundation** as a **Living Wage Employer**.

This means that no Benchmark employee working in the London region will earn less than £10.55 per hour and other employees working in the rest of the UK less than £9 per hour. Of course, most will earn more than this but this initiative is aimed at helping the lower end of the pay spectrum.

The Government's national living wage is not calculated according to what employees and their families need to live on. Benchmark feels that their employees deserve a fair day's pay for a hard day's work. They are committing to paying the **Real Living Wage** which is higher than the government minimum wage and they will make sure all of their employees receive a minimum of the Real Living Wage. The Real Living Wage rates are higher because they are independently calculated based on what people need to get by.

Benchmark have joined over 4,700 employers in the UK including a broad range of big household names such as ITV, GOOGLE, IKEA and even Chelsea FC and Everton FC.




